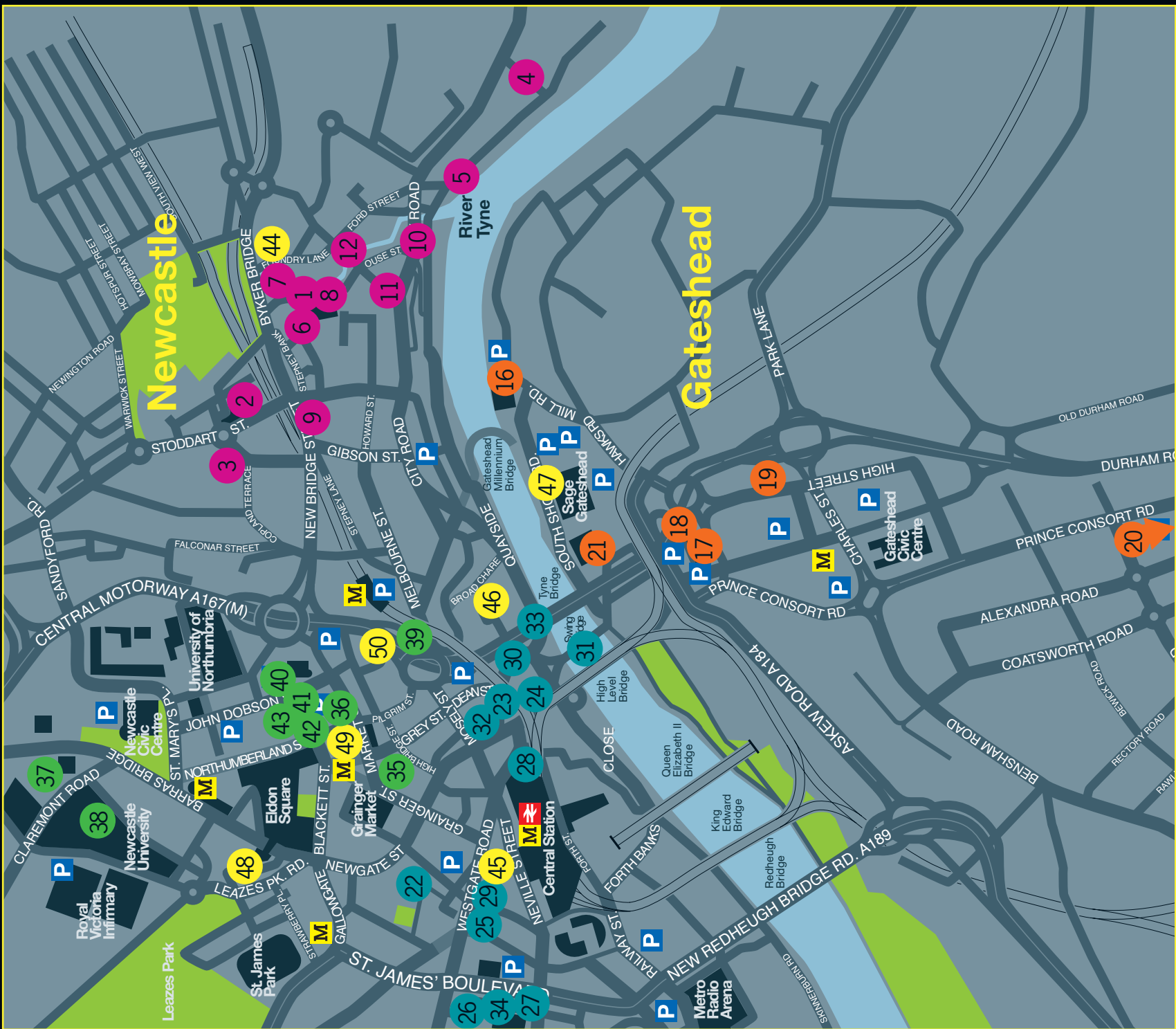

1 36 Lime Street

Friday 16 May and Saturday 17 May, 7-11pm

The artists' collective 36 Lime Street will open the doors of their grade II listed building and invite you to peek inside. Across five floors a selection of artist and maker studios will be open for you to explore. Enjoy taster sessions and demonstrations as you wander round this extraordinary warehouse designed by John Dobson. There will also be two special exhibitions: *Collective*, a pop-up exhibition with shop in our entrance gallery, and *30 Years of Making it in the Ouseburn*, tracing 36 Lime Street's fascinating history, told in members' own words and photo archive on level one.

2 The Biscuit Factory

Friday 16 May and Saturday 17 May, 7-11pm

For one weekend only the Biscuit Factory hosts its very first pop-up portrait studio inspired by figurative artist Peter Hallam. Whether you're a doodler with a pen or a master with a paintbrush your portraits will hang in the mini Late Shows gallery. The Biscuit Factory will provide the materials and curate your artworks alongside their exhibiting artists and one very lucky individual - as selected by Peter Hallam himself - will win a very special prize. When you've completed your masterpiece strike a pose as photographer Sean Elliott will be in the gallery taking innovative shots of visitors to take away with them (small charge applies).

3 The Holy Biscuit

Tea Owl will be asking you all about your favourite cuppa in their ongoing 'inves-TEA-gation' into people's tea drinking habits; so come on down and get your photo taken and become part of their participatory project *Two lumps of sugar and a dash of milk*. The Chapter House Glass Gallery will be open for you to enjoy the beautiful hand blown glass made by artist Jane Charles. Listen to some fantastic live music and have a chat with the artist herself. Anne Makepeace will be opening her doors to all those budding knitters out there, with demonstrations and helpful hints all evening - and keep your eyes peeled for knitted creatures around the cloister garden. The fantastic storytelling trio *The Moss Troopers* are back again and will be setting the scene in the beautiful 12th Century Cloister Garden with their tales of medieval revelry. Don't forget to scale the heights to take in the amazing night time views of the Tyne, the bridges and the rest of the city from the rooftop. *The Cherry Pickers*, a band known for its great music and terrible jokes will be livening up the Keep with a wide range of songs and an even wider range of instruments including washboard, spoons, banjolele, fiddle, bass and kazoo.

25 David Fry Pottery Studio

The Pottery Studio will be in full swing again with the public invited to have a go at making a pot on the wheel or by hand. You can also make a decorative clay tile, with the option of having the work glazed and fired for collection later. See an exhibition of art and ceramics in the gallery, located in an attractive courtyard that was once the courtyard of a Roman milecastle about 1,800 years ago.

26 Discovery Museum

Are you a fan of the beautiful game? Or do you like all types

of games, from historical gladiator battles to a gentle game of tennis down the park. Whatever floats your boat, come along to Games Central at Discovery Museum where you'll find plenty of ball games. Inspired by the *Toon Times* exhibition, currently on display at Discovery, take part in team challenges, one on one competition, treasure hunts and more.

27 Globe Gallery

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

Transformed from a disused bank into a contemporary art space, Globe Gallery invites you see its latest exhibitions. Ken Byers' video projection and charcoal drawings capture time when Swan Hunter's shipyard cranes dominated the Wallsend skyline, while prints, paintings and drawings by Ron Derham explore the artist's interest in tone, colour and the influence of digital printing.

28 Mining Institute

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

For the first time, you can explore all three floors of Neville Hall alongside the Mining Institute's exquisite library and lecture theatre. Visit the outstanding oak lined boardroom of the North East Railway Company and offices of the Newcastle Stock Exchange; the third floor Arbitration Room where pay deals and compensation agreements were hammered out between mine owners and unions under a domed skylight that's been hidden for generations and discover a private bomb shelter from 1938. Some musical and mechanical surprises may well be in store!

29 Newcastle Arts Centre

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

Join the launch of a brand new exhibition of sculpture by artist Lewis Robinson, exploring the paradoxical impulses of destruction and creation using found domestic objects. Upstairs on the 2nd floor you can see the annual North

of England Art Club Members Exhibition, including work by professional and semi professional artists. As you walk down Westgate Road, you will also see shop and buildings' windows transformed with artwork - look out for 55 Westgate Road, a beautiful and historic town house, currently being lovingly restored.

30 Side Gallery

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

You're invited to the opening day of Side Gallery's new exhibition, *Legacy*, curated by George Georgiou, featuring work by Polish, Ukranian, Russian, Canadian and British documentary photographers. It explores the contexts, conflicts and landscapes of the new 'debatable lands' between Russia and the European Union. Some of the photographers will be on hand and there will be a programme of presentations in Side Cinema, an intimate 51 seat venue next to the gallery.

31 Swing Bridge

Saturday 17 May only, 6pm, 7pm, 8pm and 9pm

Limited spaces, booking essential

Take a tour of one of the iconic bridges over the River Tyne. Discover the workings of its impressive hydraulic engines and find out about the history of this Newcastle landmark, built 138 years ago and owned by the Port of Tyne. Places are limited and children must be aged 12 or over. Please wear sensible footwear - no heels.

32 The Cathedral Church of St Nicholas

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

Explore the cathedral by candlelight and find out about the siege of Newcastle which happened 350 years ago. At 7.15pm, 8.15pm and 9.15pm, there will be tours of the cathedral tower, where Scottish prisoners are believed to have been kept in order to save the tower from destruction by Scottish canon. At 10pm the ancient night service of

Compline will be sung by the cathedral choir. Booking essential for the tower tours on (0191) 232 1939 and participants need to be physically fit to climb the stairs.

33 Tyne Bridge Tower

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

Venture inside the Northern tower of the Tyne Bridge to experience *Inhibitor*, an audiovisual piece by Ed Carter exploring PARP inhibitors - a new type of cancer treatment discovered in Newcastle. *Inhibitor* combines fluorescent images of cancer cells with a new musical composition based on the amino acid sequence of PARP. Created by Ed Carter and the Northern Institute of Cancer Research. Supported by Newcastle University and Cancer Research UK.

34 Tyne & Wear Archives

Saturday 17 May only, 7-11pm

Games galore in the Archives! Inspired by Discovery Museum's *Toon Times* exhibition, explore our sporting heritage in the BFI Mediatheque where you can view hundreds of free film and TV clips from over the years. From local rivalries in the Tyne-Wear derby to swimming galas in Tynemouth Harbour, there's sure to be something for everyone.

36 Commercial Union House

Ampersand Inventions - 4th floor

For one night only Ampersand Inventions will be turned into an emporium of artistic anthropology, where all can come and explore the curious nature of the creative clan that resides within its walls. Learn art gallery friendly linguistics with essential phrases in the mother tongue of some of Europe's greatest classical artists at the hands of language mavericks *BlahBlahBlah International Languages*. The Café is made and presented by the HUB, a Cultural Project for learning disabled people.

Newcastle Performance Collective - 6th floor
